North Sulawesi, Indonesia Flooding Emergency

Torrential rains fell in northeastern Indonesia for four days beginning January 14, causing floods that have devastated houses, claimed lives, and destroyed livelihood. The National disaster Mitigation Agency reports that there are 6 people dead. The disaster occurred again after the rain flooded the city of Manado again on January 21, claiming 3 more lives, one missing, and approximately 2000 displaced. The Indonesian province of North Sulawesi is home to many Christian and Catholic communities, much higher in proportion to the rest of the Muslim majority nation.

A monetary collection to aid the victims of the flood is being received by The Reformed Church of Metuchen. If you wish to make a donation towards the North Sulawesi Flood Victims, please note on your offering envelope and on the memo line of your check.
